NEW SENIOR CENTER SATELLITE IN STRASBURG: The Tuscarawas County Senior Center (TCSC) is announcing a new satellite center in Strasburg for the 50+ population to enjoy. This decision was made by the Senior Center Board of Directors at their regular monthly meeting in June, where the Board voted unanimously to accept the business plan for the Strasburg Senior Center and create a new satellite in the county.

"We are very excited for this new center to open and the impact it will have on those 50 and older people living in and around the Village of Strasburg. Our main Dover site will provide supportive services as well as linkages to all programs and services offered including transportation, minor home repairs, in-home services and fitness," shared Jamie L. Smith, Executive Director of the TCSC.

The Strasburg Senior Center will be located at the United Methodist Church, 206 2nd Street, N.W., Strasburg. "The church, like the synagogues of Bible times, should be the center of the community. I am excited about this opportunity and eager for the opportunities for our seniors," expressed Reverend Matthew Wald. The Center is se to open on Tuesday,

September 5, at 8:00 AM. The days of operation will initially be Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays from 8:00 AM – 1:00 PM and will be closed for observed holidays and when Strasburg-Franklin Local Schools are closed due to inclement weather. Programs and services offered will be Bingo, card games, crafts, educational speakers, fitness classes, Bible study, and more. Lunch will be offered for \$4.00 per person. All lunches will be ordered through the Strasburg Senior Center and delivered by the TCSC. The Strasburg Senior Center can be reached at 330-878-4048.
