PINE RIDGE CHRISTMAS SERVICE PROJECT: This year's Pine Ridge Christmas Service Project will benefit the new Strasburg Senior Center. If you would like to make a donation, needed items are listed below and/or checks made payable to the Strasburg Senior Center. Checks should be enclosed in an envelope marked "Pine Ridge Christmas Project" on the front of the envelope and then deposited in the lock box on the front porch at the Community Center. If donating needed items, please place them in the box located inside the Community Center near the TV. Donations can be made from December 1 - 20. Needed items include: clock; printer paper; printer ink; stamps; puzzles; books (new or slightly used); 1-3 pound weights; paper towels; toilet paper; plastic silverware; napkins; coffee; electric pencil sharpener; tape; white out; envelopes; Uno & Uno flip cards; dominoes (set up to #12); Skipbo cards; acrylic paints; paint brushes; glue; and board games (new or slightly used).



STRASBURG SENIOR CENTER: The Center is open Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays from 8:00 AM-1:00 PM at the United Methodist Church in Strasburg. Membership is \$10 per year. Membership includes a newsletter with all the month's activities as well as the menus for the month. Lunches come from the Dover Senior Center and are \$4.00. They must be ordered and paid for a week ahead. It is possible to order for the whole month. Every week there are

Euchre and Bingo games as well as exercise and Bible study. Several times a month there is a craft in which you can participate. You need to sign up for specific classes listed in the newsletter.

The Center is on Facebook under Strasburg Senior Center. You can see some of the activities there. In November they are selling several styles and colors of shirts with the Center's logo on them, and they can be ordered on-line. There is also an Amazon symbol on Facebook showing donations that can be made. While the Center does get some tax dollars through the main center in Dover, there are still expenses which the Strasburg Center incurs such as the expense of printing the newsletter, prizes for games and many other, including rent.

INFORMATION FROM STRASBURG FIRE CHIEF LASKEY: At Fire Chief Laskey's presentation on November 2, he provided us with some valuable information and contact numbers.

- 1) He left some magnetic FILE OF LIFE pockets for us to put on our refrigerators. The paper inside the pockets needs to be filled out with your specific medical information and then attach the pocket to your refrigerator. The pockets can be valuable tools in case you are unable to tell the EMTs the information they need to assist you, expedites your medical assessment and provides them with your specific contact information. The pockets are available at the Community Center, if you would like to pick one up.
- 2) He also demonstrated a security box to place your house key in and can be hung over the top of your door. The first responders are the only people who can access the key. Their key is kept in their vehicle in a secured lock box. These house security boxes are <u>free</u> and you can get one by contacting the Fire Department.



Chief Laskey stressed that they want to help whenever needed. Please call and they will come out and answer questions or help fill out the FILE OF LIFE informational sheet.


